Our work will inspire us to write some exciting Egyptian mystery stories and non-fiction books and the internet will provide us with information to write an explanation how to mummify a pharaoh and write non-chronological reports about Pharaohs.

Maths

Throughout this term, the children will be taught the concept of numbers up to 1 million. They will also learn about calculation approaches of numbers up to 1,000 and how this can be applied to multiples of 1,000 up to 1 million and beyond (Year 6) They will also learn more about different types of shapes and the concept of time.

How to help your child at home:

- All children should know times tables up to 12×12 and corresponding facts. Just 5 minutes time a day will keep these fresh. Both Purple Mash and TTRockstars have support. If your child doesn't have a password, please ask your child's class teacher.
- Practise and learn 5 weekly facts.

Topic: Pharaohs



Let's travel back 5000 years to ancient Egypt, cruising along the Nile and entering a world of mysteries, curses and mummies.

This half term, we are going to learn first-hand about the gruesome, yet fascinating, process of mummification. We will use different sources to research Tutankhamun's tomb. We'll also consider whether it was right to open Tutankhamun's tomb, or whether it should have been left as it was. We'll draw Egyptian artefacts in detail, focusing on symbols and design features. Studying historical sources will help us learn more about the Pharaohs, the Egyptian gods and ancient religious beliefs. We'll find out about the food that was eaten at the time, make some Egyptian bread and use recycled materials to build model tombs. At the end of the ILP, we'll think about how the ancient Egyptians contributed to world history, then create and present a guide about ancient Egyptian sites.

Help your child prepare for their project

It's amazing that a civilisation from 5000 years ago still influences the way we live today, from mathematics to bowling! Why not try a variety of fruits for dessert that the ancient Egyptians would buy from their local market? You could taste juicy cantaloupes, sweet dates or flavoursome plums. You could also visit your local library to learn about the amazing world of ancient Egypt. Alternatively, use online maps to look at famous Egyptian landmarks and track the course of the Nile.
