Autumn Term 1 2023 Curriculum Overview

English

Children in years 3 and 4 will be focussing on nonchronological reports. The end goal is to write a nonchronological report on mountains. During the first week of term we will focus on our punctuation ladder (attached below). This will give us a good basis for when we write our non-chorological report. We will then hold a hook day (which will include a mini hike around the school grounds and making our own mountains). After this we will look at a non-chronological report WAGOLL (what a good one looks like) and find the features and use each of these as a lesson. This will build up our skill set until we are ready to independently write the report.

Maths

The first part of our coverage develops the concept of place value in numbers up to 1000 and the children will be comparing, ordering, rounding and writing numbers. As our understanding of number progresses, we will look to consolidate the four operations and be able to reason with these. This will include identifying missing numbers in column methods, explaining why some numbers require to be 'carried over' and looking to increase our speed and fluency in our mental maths. We will also be focusing on times tables, with daily practice on TT rockstars and all children taking part in club 99.

This term our projects are ...

Our LKS2 topic is mountains.

This will be cross curricular and inform our learning in English, Music and Art.

Our hook day will also involve the children hiking the distance of Mount Everest and making our own mountains.

Science this term is focused on animals, movement and nutrition.

This will include lessons on skeletons, the bone in our bodies. The children will also look at healthy eating, nutrients groups and balanced diets.

Assessment will be carried out at the beginning and end of unit..

Then in Autumn 2 our topic is Fantastic Mr Fox.

This will assist with our Fiction writing in English. We will look at the story in depth, focusing on characters, settings and events.

We will also use drama and theatre to enhance the children's knowledge of the text.

Science will focus on forces and space, this will involve lots of practical activities and investigations.

Once again assessment will be carried out at the beginning and end of term.
