

Early Years Foundation Stage: NURSERY TADPOLES



Phonics + Literacy

Nursery children will continue to focus on developing their oral blending skills through the use of 'Fred Talk'. For example, can you h-o-p, pass me the j-a-m, I like ch-i-p-s. After sounding out the word children learn to orally blend the word together to tell you the whole word = hop/jam/chips. We also learn a new sound each week and explore objects that start with that sound. We also follow Phase 1 Letter and Sounds to develop children's speaking and listening skills. Some children will also take part in Early Talk Boost interventions.

They will be developing their listening skills through games and learning lots of nursery rhymes. The more you sing Nursery Rhymes and Counting Songs and the more stories you read to your child now, the better reader they will become!

Children are given opportunities to explore mark making with a variety of resources such as paint, chalk, pens, sand, shaving foam and develop their fine motor skills by building up the dexterity in their hands through using pegs, tweezers, scissors, etc.

This term we will be reading lots of traditional tales including The Gingerbread Man, The Three Billy Goats Gruff and Jack and the Beanstalk. We will develop our vocabulary, join in with retelling stories and create simple story maps.

Nursery children will join in with number rhymes and counting small amounts of objects accurately . We also encourage subitising—if you can see there are 3 then you don't need to count them! Children will start to recognise numerals and order these as well as identify more and fewer. We will be looking for shapes in our environment - go on a shape hunt at home too!

We will sort objects based on size and learn to use positional language such as in, on, under, over, behind, in front, next to, up, down, between.

We will develop our language of measures and look at 'tallest' and 'shortest'. This will be useful when we start to compare the growth of our plants!

Which Fairy Tales do we love?

Understand the World (UTW): We will discuss Winter, look at materials and celebrate Pancake Day and Chinese New Year. We make the most of our wonderful forest area to discuss changes in the environment over time and make compassions between environments. We discuss our weather daily. Physical Development (PD): We understand that children need to move and need opportunities to develop their gross (big) and fine (small) motor skills. Our environment is set up to support this alongside carefully planned activities such as making gingerbread people!

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD): Junk modelling; collage; performing stories; puppets and observational character paintings are our focus this term.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED): What is special about me? We will learn about special customs and beliefs and similarities and differences. We continue to reinforce our Grange Values and use The Colour Monster to support us with our

own and others emotions.

How do things grow?

Understand the World (UTW): We will explore Spring, growing vegetables, caring for plants and living things, life cycles and celebrate Mother's Day and Easter. We continue to make the most of our wonderful forest area to discuss changes in the environment over time and make compassions between environments. We discuss our weather daily.

Physical Development (PD): We understand that children need to move and need opportunities to develop their gross (big) and fine (small) motor skills. Our environment is set up to support this alongside carefully planned activities such as making Easter nests!

Expressive Arts and Design (EAD): Collage; printing; texture; weaving; observational paintings/drawings and Easter songs are our focus this term.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED): What is special about the world around me? We will discuss caring for our environment and learn about special places in our community. We continue to reinforce our Grange Values and use The Colour Monster to support us with our own and others emotions.

Learning at home




Children are welcome to borrow books from our library. We encourage you to share songs and stories as often as you can as it will have a major impact on how your children will learn to read themselves whilst also fostering a love for reading.

Children in Tadpole Class are also encouraged to recite numbers in order, count objects carefully and spot numbers and shapes in the environment, e.g. a group of three flowers.

If you can continue to support us by toilet training including hand washing and drying, practising getting dressed, eating with a knife, fork, spoon and drinking from an open cup then your children will have a strong start in school.
